



Patient Participation Group (PPG) update for village newsletters

We're pleased to share the headline news from the recent October PPG meeting.

Our Practice Manager, Di Waller, shared the following information:

#### Consultations by phone or face to face

- □ Total calls for September 8,511 Just short of 400 per day
- □ Telephone call consultations 3,145
- $\Box$  Face to Face consultations 4,347
- □ Dispensary Calls 1,019

#### Prescriptions

 $\Box$  Over 9000 + prescription items dispensed by the pharmacy. (This does not include the prescriptions for patients to whom we cannot dispense for, or for those patients who choose

to go elsewhere.)

 $\Box$  A significant number of prescriptions continue to remain uncollected every month wasting time, money and valuable medication.

Our meeting was attended by Emma Teasdale of Healthwatch, Oxford who told us about her work supporting health initiatives and researching the views of all health service users across the county. Further details about Healthwatch can be found at: https://healthwatchoxfordshire.co.uk

The proposed new housing developments in Hook Norton and Milcombe and their potential impact on health services was discussed. It seems possible that we might see a further 300+ new homes being built which is likely to generate 1000 patients additional to our current 8,000.

Neither Bloxham nor Hook Norton surgeries has space or land to expand and existing buildings and facilities are already overstretched.

It was unanimously agreed that the PPG should raise these concerns with our M.P., local councillors and the relevant planning authorities.

We shall write again early in the New Year but in the meantime please remember to continue to check the Practice website for news and announcements.



Working for the RSPCA and animal wildlife rescue, I have seen horrific injuries caused by fireworks and bonfires.


Not wanting to be a party pooper I am just calling people up to be sensible and think before they light.

We have had a very positive and fun-filled first half-term here at Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School. Our Year 5 & 6 Oak Class children ventured off to Shropshire for a four night residential at Condover Hall. They had a really wonderfultime, challenging themselves to try things they hadn't done before and learning newthings about themselves. From kayaking to laser quest, buggy building to high ropes, every day had something new and the children made the most of it. The staff at Condover commented really positively about how respectful and polite all of the children were.

Back at school, Willow class had a focus on Black History month, finding out about all sorts of things about important people and events in the history of the African diaspora. As well as researching and sharing lots of facts, they created some lovely art work too using a range of media including collage, pastel, paint and pen. 





My name is Carole Weston and I live in Deddington, but my family are from Tadmarton and Swalcliffe. My mother's maiden name was Margaret Freeman, and my father was Ronald Mepham. I recently had the opportunity to visit the Kranji War Graves Cemetery in Singapore and complete a long held wish to pay respects to a family member who sadly died during WW2. My mother's cousin was Bernard Austin Freeman, and he may have surviving relatives living locally and I hope they would be pleased to know that I was able to lay a wreath in his name. Bernard's story is one which has always saddened me as I try to imagine how a young man was taken from his life in and around a North Oxfordshire village and sent halfway round the world to fight in a country that could not have been more different than the one he left. The heat in Singapore is harsh and oppressive and no doubt none of the men sent there had ever encountered such conditions before. Bernard's full story can be found on the web site "The Fallen of Tadmarton" and is fascinating but chilling account of his time in Singapore and other areas as a serving soldier and a POW and I recommend you read this report when thinking of the fallen during the period of remembrance.

Bernard lost his life while being transported by the Japanese by sea to Japan, the ship he was in was attacked by American forces as it had no markings that it was carrying POW's and as such he has no known grave. I laid a wreath at his name which is etched on a column at the top of a hill overlooking the cemetery which is a beautiful, peaceful place surrounded by lush vegetation and gardens. Like all the cemeteries under the War Grave Commissions care it is extremely well cared for and the Singapore nation still hold the sacrifices of our soldiers in great respect. Singapore is a destination known for its tourism, architecture, food and shopping but I recommend you do what I did, hire a driver to go and visit this cemetery and spend a quiet time remembering all those whose names are etched in stone. I have several photos of the cemetery if any descendant of Bernard would like to have copies, please contact me through the newsletter.
