





SWALCLIFFE BARN NEWS

The barn has got off to a good start this year with three special group openings yielding a total of 62 visitors contributing to a total of 91





The Lower Tadmarton Finger Post Saga

Well its in! That's the first thing to say. After a 2 year absence, the finger post as shown magnificently on the front cover (photo by Sue Gibb) is finally back in place.

The story began back in 2022 when a young fella failed to negotiate the bend on the 5 ways triangle and ploughed straight through Mrs Lee's fence, taking with him the fingerpost. He was shaken but unharmed.

A special thanks to Mrs Lee for taking the initiative and securing the name address and insurance details of the driver, otherwise we are pretty sure the post would be history by now.

Also thanks to Mr and Mrs Gibb for retrieving and storing the broken post and fingers.

The PC then identified a specialist repair company called Leander Architectural based in the Derby area and personally couriered the broken bits up to the repairers.

From this point we held our breath as to whether a repair could take place on such a damaged and old fingerpost. But we have to say that Leander were exceptional in their communication and response. They sent photos of the repair process as it went along and confirmed that the majority would still be the original.

From this point to actually getting it back in the ground, meant some dogged determination by the PC and Clerk Christine Coles as all the purchase orders and agreements of who is paying who, and for what, were slowly brought together.

The fully restored post finally came back to the Highways depot in Deddington and was within touching distance. We even asked if we could install it ourselves, however as it doesn't belong to us, the answer was no.

Finally (and without notice) a Parish Councillor spotted men in orange jackets at the triangle digging! After an unconvincing conversation about what they had on their wagon, the Parish Councillor jumped on the wagon and rifled round to find the post. It looked so new, that initially they thought it was a fake plastic one. However they were quickly reassured when they found the delivery note and information from Leander Architectural attached. Phew, it was the original.

I think you can agree it looks magnificent!!!

Swalcliffe Nature report

We are all likely aware that The Swalcliffe Parish Council took the environmentally supportive and innovative decision to continue the NO MOW MAY initiative this spring. The decision has been largely adhered to within Swalcliffe, though disappointingly Highways and County Councils adjoining the Parish and outside its area of control, continue, often, to mow and cut back roadside verges with the ruthlessness of latter day Vandals in classical times!

Why are roadside verges so important for wildlife? As well as designated wild areas, birds particularly need the security of uninterrupted, uncultivated, green corridors where they can travel and feed between their undisturbed habitats, unmolested from the hazards, to them ,of human habitation, roads and managed farmland. This natural 'trunk road' resource is invaluable to sustain bird populations, particularly in summer for our insectivorous warbler and songbird migrants.

Swalcliffe's NO MOW MAY has been a great success adding to a notable improvement in our village's flora and fauna. An abundance of uncut *Cow Parsley, Forget-me-nots, Borage* and *Harebell*, together with other flora beyond my powers of identification, has increased the number of pollinating insects and as such, these insects as a food source, has led to an increase in Swalcliffe's avifauna. I have noted an upturn in insectivorous warbler numbers such as *Blackcap* and *Whitethroat* and even the more uncommon hedge hugging *Lesser Whitethroat*. Our *Chiffchaff* populations continue to thrive, though unfortunately, the once common *Willow Warbler* now seems to have disappeared from the woods of Swalcliffe.

For the second year running we have had a small flock of *Swifts*, screaming over the village like a squadron of Japanese zero fighters. Sadly there appears again to be the inexorable drop in *Swallow* and *House Martin* populations. While certainly this could be due to less suitable nesting sites across the UK, I am afraid netting in sub-Saharan Africa and along the North African coast prior to migratory birds crossing the Mediterranean, are major contributing factors to lower hirundine numbers in Swalcliffe, as elsewhere. We should all seek to provide new and not disturb existing, nesting sites for these vulnerable birds, wherever possible.

Ending on a more positive note, over the remainder of the summer, keep a look-out in the skies for the *Hobby*, a glorious little migratory falcon, swift shape , smaller than a *Kestrel*, with *Peregrine Falcon* like plumage and red haunches. 



Within seconds it told me I was hearing an Eurasian Blackcap, a bird I don't think I've ever seen. Although happy with that, I left the app running for about 10 mins whilst I finished hanging out the washing.


To my surprise, it identified a further 14 birds singing in the vicinity. They were.....

Blackbird, Robin, Barn Swallow, Rook, Magpie, Goldfinch, Wren, Great Tit, Carrion Crow, Swift, Wood Pigeon, House Sparrow, Chaffinch and Jackdaw.

As well as this amazing collection, we also regularly see Blue Tits, Nuthatches, Dunnocks, Thrushes, Jays, Great Spotted Woodpeckers, Green Woodpeckers, Pheasants, Greenfinches, Long-tailed Tits, Stock Doves, Collared-Doves and a family of squirrels at our bird feeders, and if we wander across the fields, we see buzzards and sky larks.

What an amazing part of the world we live in, full of the most beautiful fauna and flora!!
