What a contrast in the weather to last year when we'd had warnings of torrential rain, high winds and thunderstorms! With this year's long, hot, dry summer we'd been praying for rain to make the going a bit softer, thankfully we had some a few days before.

This year we decided to go 'Back to our Roots' and started the ride where it all began at our livery yard in Lower Tadmarton. The route took the riders across Duncan Jacks' farm (our old family farm) coming out on the Tadmarton Golf Course Road, over Ushercombe Farm to Upper Tadmarton, then over more of Duncan's land - fields and fields of stubble — a joy for the riders! To end up at Swalcliffe Cutting, along Park Lane to Swalcliffe Park Equestrian Centre where everyone had fun jumping and splashing through the water; having their photo taken by our long-standing professional photographer Cordelia Noble.

Taylor Farms kindly let us go up their grass margins to High Ways, where some people took a shortcut down the road but the majority carried on across Tadmarton Heath crossroads past Lesser Farm and along the Old Railway Line to Milcombe, over a couple of fields to Davenport's, then back down Duncan's land to the start - approximately 10 miles!

The day ran exceptionally smoothly, sadly numbers were slightly down; we're blaming the hard ground. However, those that did the ride were extremely happy and commented how lucky we are to live in such a beautiful part of the country, with such amazing riding.

After expenses, we have been able to send £1150 to each of our charities, namely Thames Valley Air Ambulance and Frank Wise Special School, Banbury. We have now raised over £77,000 in total for our various charities over the past 26 years.

Many thanks to the farmers and land owners who allowed us to cross their land, especially their private land; this makes the ride extra special for our local participants. We are so grateful to those who moved their stock - it is really appreciated! It enables us to leave the gates open, which makes the ride all the more enjoyable and also means we need less helpers. This year's ride had 26 gates all of which we were able to leave open! As always, a special thank you to Swalcliffe Park Equestrian for the ongoing use of their brilliant cross country course – this makes our fun ride quite unique!

Massive thanks to my husband Kevin, mum Di Green and Nicky for coming to the rescue with the refreshments, when the catering van we'd booked, cancelled at the last minute! Thank you to Geoff and Lyn Flowers for supplying tables and catering equipment, Tor Taylor for the tea urn – nothing better than a burger or sausage in a bun followed by tea and homemade cake!

Huge thanks to Mum who donated the rosettes this year, as she has frequently done in the past, this lowered our expenses considerably.

My own personal thanks must go to our liveries and friends at High Meadow Farm Livery, whether they rode the ride, marshalled, donated or baked a cake. The ride would not happen without you. Special thanks to Nicky who again took a week or so off work to waymark the route with me.

Tadmarton Charities

As in the past I thought it would be helpful to give a little background to the charity especially for new people to the village

Tadmarton Charities is an amalgamation of the Poor's Land Charity, the Macdermot Charity and the Macdermot's Educational Charity. The Poor's Land Charity arose from the Inclosures Act of 1775 when a small area of land, which is now part of Tadmarton Golf Course, was made available to help the poor and needy of the parish. Subsequently this land was swapped for the 16 acres which the charities now own. This comprises of 2 fields which run down from the golf course road and up to a field owned by the Banbury Ornithological Society.

The 16 acres of land provide a rental income which in most years covers the income distributed to those recipients in the parish who have regularly received support. In addition, the Charity has an investment holding in M & G Charifund which contains monies received for granting a right of access to the Banbury Ornithological Society land back in 2005 and a small sum held in a Building Society Account.

These holdings do not routinely distribute income but are used for the ongoing administration of the Charity and to enable additional distribution of funds where deemed appropriate. Over the last few years this has been required. The Trustees are strictly bound by the trust deed which allows us to 'relieve either generally, or individually, those residents of the Parish who are considered to be in genuine need, or suffering hardship, or distress'. It is interesting to look back and see that in 1867 the charity delivered coal to 70 families who were deemed to qualify.

However there are still people and families who are in genuine need and it is the trustees job to allocate funds to them.

They do of course rely on people applying for themselves or nominating others.

The Trustees would now like to hear from any person who feels that they, a neighbour, friend, or family member, might qualify for consideration for the 2022 distribution.

The name, address and brief details should be provided to the Clerk to the Trustees at the address given below.

Those who have always received help from the Charity will automatically be considered and need not reapply.

So my resolution is to see the other point of view, try to understand where someone else comes from, at the same time hoping they are willing to do the same for me.


On that note I wish you all a beautiful Autumn, with respect for all that lives. (That includes spiders)

The Estate have objected and the OCC Countryside Service are trying to arrange an urgent site meeting.

<u>To discuss and agree the protocol for the defibrillators in the village</u>

Since the sad incident during the summer, the Parish Council have reassessed the protocol to access the three defibrillators in the village. Detailed facts and advice from many organisations were obtained. A detailed document has now been produced and will be copied and delivered to everyone. Another training session will be arranged.

To discuss the placement of the Platinum Jubilee bench The bench is currently residing safely in a garden. It was agreed to place it outside the village hall nearest the churchyard. It will need to be secured to the ground. Quotes to block pave and replace the railings will be sought.
