The Winter Fuel Payment has changed and we are urging older people across Oxfordshire to check whether they are entitled to Pension Credit or any other qualifying benefits.


The Winter Fuel Payment is an annual tax-free payment for households that include someone born on or before 23rd September 1958 (for 2024-25) designed to help cover heating costs in winter, with households receiving up to £300.

Previously, the payment was not mean-tested, but changes by the current Government mean that only those receiving certain benefits will receive the contribution to heating costs.

Pension Credit is the primary way older people can continue to receive the Winter Fuel Payment, and with an estimate of more than 4,000 older people across the county not claiming the Pension Credit to which they're entitled, it's more important than ever that people check their eligibility.

Pension Credit is an income-related benefit that tops up weekly income to £218.15 for a single person and to a joint £332.95 for a couple.

So if you know anyone eligible for Pension Credit, please encourage them to apply online at www.gov.uk/pension-credit or by calling 0800 99 1234.





A VICTORAIN PHOTOGRAPH OF SWALCLIFFE CHURCH

The photograph overleaf was recently discovered, or should I say re-discovered, in the Swalcliffe Archive It was collected during the Swalcliffe Parish History Project which began in 1977 and continued for several years during which a considerable amount of historical information was collected, forming the foundations for the Swalcliffe Archive and, in 1987, the Swalcliffe Society itself.

We know of the many photographs taken by the Chipping Norton photographer Packer, mostly in the 1920s and 1930s, so it is especially interesting to find in our archive this photograph taken in the Victorian era, the earliest we have found so far. The things that are present and not present in this photograph enable us to provide an approximate dating for it.

Lighting: The wrought iron candle stands mounted on the pews were installed by Rev. Payne and Mr Norris in 1862 (since removed), but the hanging oil lanterns that light the church today and converted to electricity in 1933 are not visible.

Heating: There are heating pipes visible in the centre aisle and it is clear that the pews were then mounted on a wooden platform the floor of which is higher than the heating pipes. This platform subsequently suffered woodworm and death-watch beetle and was removed, following which the pews were reinstalled directly on the stone floor of the nave. The heating pipes were most likely removed at the same time.

The Texts: above the arches are curved placards containing religious texts, never seen in other photographs. These perhaps they relate to a religious festival or celebration.

The Reredos: The present Reredos, installed in 1887 by the will of Rev Edward Payne, had not yet been installed because the whole east window is visible in this photo.


The Organ: The present organ in the North aisle installed by Rev Wilkinson in 1893 is not visible in this photograph, however clearly visible are at least two rows of pews at the east end of the north aisle and where the present organ stands there is a railing enclosing something obscured by the pillar, perhaps an earlier smaller organ. From Rev Payne's memoirs of 1876 we read that in 1842 a "small but well toned organ was placed in the then existing Western Gallery... displacing a violincello, clarinette and all kinds of music". But in 1854 the West Gallery "occupied as usual by its singers and its roughs" was cleared away by Payne and the gallery organ moved to the North Aisle, most likely to the location behind the railing seen in this photo. (Information from Payne's memoirs dated 1876)

We can therefore propose a tentative date for this photo. The earliest date would be 1862 when the candle stands were installed by Payne and Norris. The latest date would be 1887 when the Reredos was installed. A probable date would be around 1876 to celebrate the completion of the substantial restoration of the church commenced by Payne in 1854, and the texts above the arches might have been installed to celebrate this completion.

We do not know the source of this photograph so we are so far unable to give credits to its photographer. If you have seen this photograph before or know where it comes from the Swalcliffe Society would welcome further information.



Tadmarton Charities

As in the past I thought it would be helpful to give a little background to the charity especially for new people to the village.

Tadmarton Charities is an amalgamation of the Poor's Land Charity, the Macdermot Charity and the Macdermot's Educational Charity. The Poor's Land Charity arose from the Inclosures Act of 1775 when a small area of land, which is now part of Tadmarton Golf Course, was made available to help the poor and needy of the parish. Subsequently this land was swapped for the 16 acres which the charities now own. This comprises of 2 fields which run down from the golf course road and up to a field owned by the Banbury Ornithological Society.

The 16 acres of land provide a rental income which in most years covers the income distributed to those recipients in the parish who have regularly received support. In addition, the Charity has an investment holding in M & G Charifund which contains monies received for granting a right of access to the Banbury Ornithological Society land back in 2005 and a small sum held in a Building Society Account.

These holdings do not routinely distribute income but are used for the ongoing administration of the Charity and to enable additional distribution of funds where deemed appropriate.

The Trustees are strictly bound by the trust deed which allows us to 'relieve either generally, or individually, those residents of the Parish who are considered to be in genuine need, or suffering hardship, or distress'. It is interesting to look back and see that in 1867 the charity delivered coal to 70 families who were deemed to qualify.

However there are still people and families who are in genuine need and it is the trustees job to allocate funds to them.

They do of course rely on people applying for themselves or nominating others.

The Trustees would now like to hear from any person who feels that they, a neighbour, friend, or family member, might qualify for consideration for the 2024 distribution.

This year has seen the withdrawal of the winter fuel allowance for those not on pension credits and it may be that more people will feel the need to apply to us.

The name, address and brief details should be provided to the Clerk to the Trustees at the address given below.

Those who have always received help from the Charity will automatically be considered and need not reapply.


Keep an eye open for event announcements in the local noticeboards.

The lights we see in the night sky are in actual fact caused by activity on the surface of the Sun. Solar storms on our star's surface give out huge clouds of electrically charged particles. These particles can travel millions of miles, and some may eventually collide with the Earth

Most of these particles are deflected away, but some become captured in the Earth's magnetic field, accelerating down towards the north and south poles into the atmosphere. This is why aurora activity is concentrated at the magnetic poles.

"These particles then slam into atoms and molecules in the Earth's atmosphere and essentially heat them up," explains Royal Observatory astronomer Tom Kerss. "We call this physical process 'excitation', but it's very much like heating a gas and making it glow."

What we are seeing therefore are atoms and molecules in our atmosphere colliding with particles from the Sun. The aurora's characteristic wavy patterns and 'curtains' of light are caused by the lines of force in the Earth's magnetic field.

Different gases give off different colours when they are heated. The same process is also taking place in the aurora.

The two primary gases in the Earth's atmosphere are nitrogen and oxygen, and these elements give off different colours during an aurora display

The green we see in the aurora is characteristic of oxygen, while hints of purple, blue or pink are caused by nitrogen.

"We sometimes see a wonderful scarlet red colour, and this is caused by very high altitude oxygen interacting with solar particles," adds astronomer Tom. "This only occurs when the aurora is particularly energetic."
